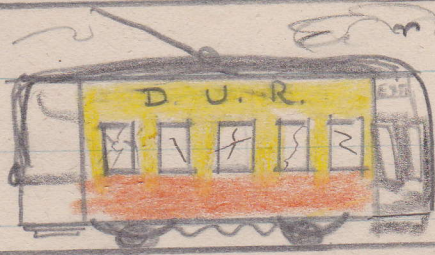

DETROIT KNEW NO HEAVY TRAFFIC UNTILL THIS MORNING WHEN GASOLINE DRIVEN MACHINES WERE FORCED TO DUTY. TRUCKS OF ALL SIZES AND OF ALL SORTS. PACKARDS, FORDS, DODGES, AND EVERY OTHER MAKE IN U.S. PASSED NORTH. SOUTH, EAST AND WEST AT INERVALS OF A FEW SECONDS.

PEOPLE WALK, AND WAIT.

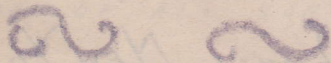

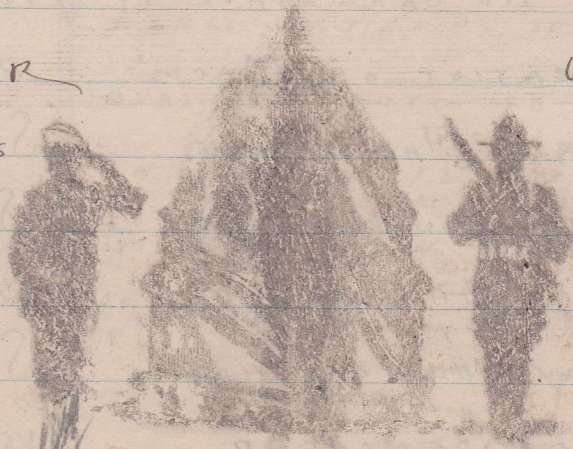
