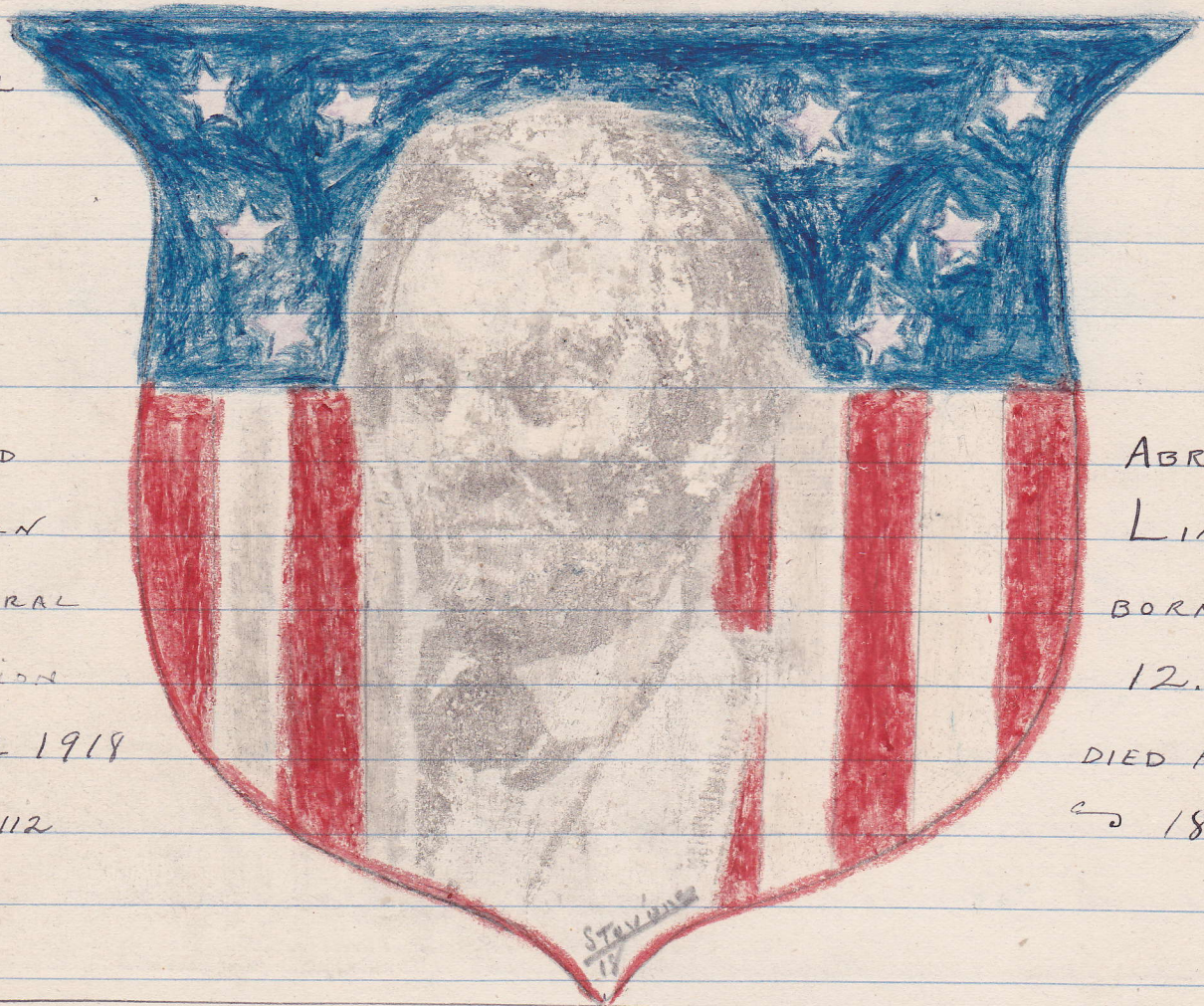

CHICAGO FEB 8 "WHAT HAVE YOU

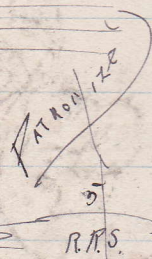

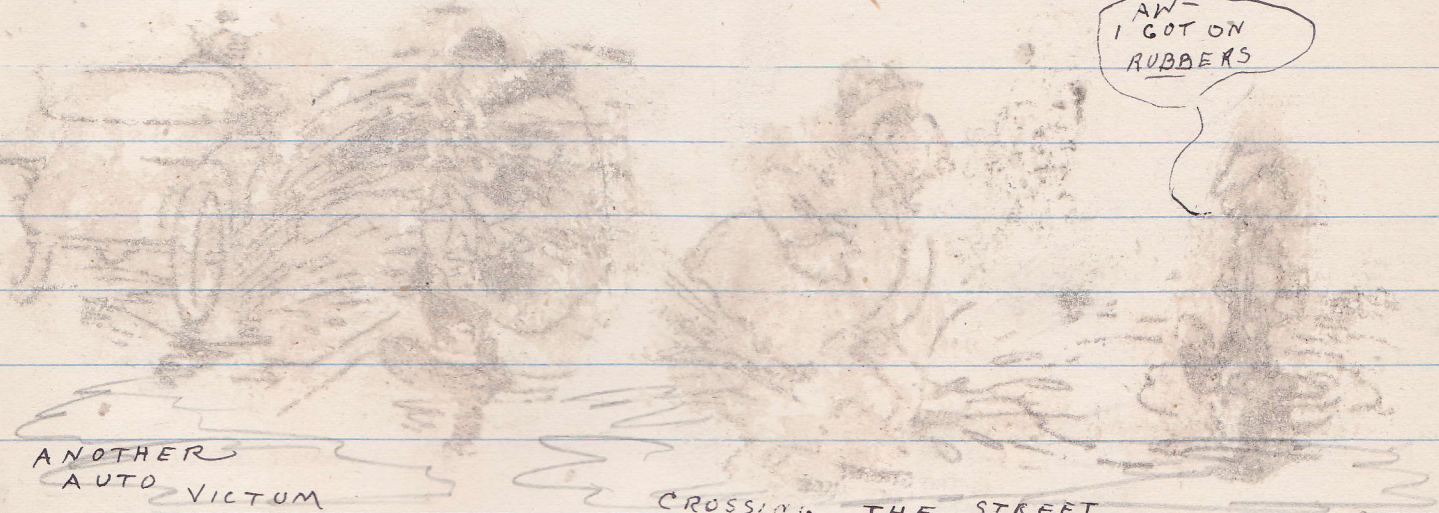

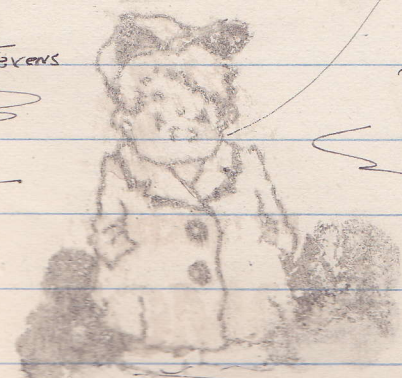
