# GERMANY SIGNS TRUCE; WAR ENDS:

REBELS SIEZE FACTORIES, RAILROADS AND

SHIPS; KAISER FLEES TO HOLLAND.

HOSTILITIES END AT SIX THIS MORNING.

THE GERMAN COMMETTE AT GENERAL FOCHE'S HEADQUARTERS HAS SIGNED THE PEACE TRUCE, HOSTILITIES CEASED AT SIX O'CLOCK THIS MORNING:

GERMANY IS IN A STATE OF REVOLT, THE REBELS HAVE SIZED THE RAILROADS AND THE KRUP PLANT IS IN THE HANDS OF REVLITIONESTS; MANY MORE NAVAL SHIPS JOIN REVOLUTION.

THE KAISER AND A MILITARY PARTY GO TOWARDS HOLLAND IN ARMORED MOTER CARS : DISPATCHES FROM HOLLAND STATE THAT THE KAISER AND THE ROYAL PARTY WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE COUNTRY.

## KAISER RUNS TO HOLLAND

Celebration greatest in History:

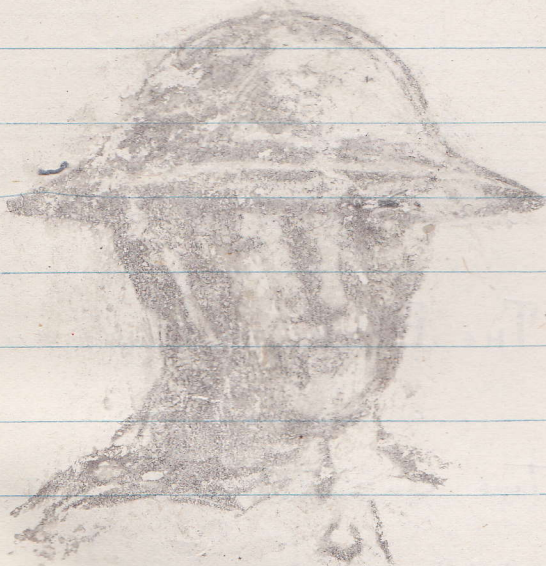
A Holiday was proclaimed and men hurried home

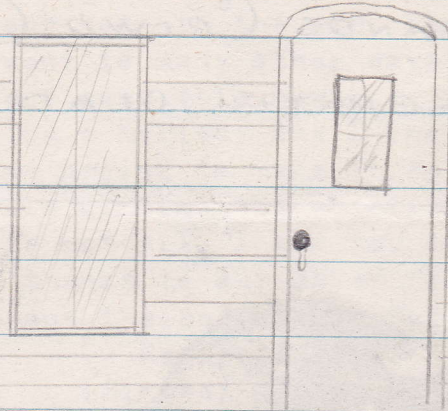
